Utah Project Portal is now open for Unified Water Infrastructure Plan projects!

Purpose

Moving forward, the **Utah Project Portal** will be the official platform for submitting and managing projects under the **Unified Water Infrastructure Plan (UWIP)**. This portal will allow entities to log in, access their data and comprehensively plan for their projects. In addition, this is the data that will be utilized by the relevant agencies and the **Water Development Coordinating Council** to compile a comprehensive prioritized list for the formulation of the Unified Water Infrastructure Plan. Any entity expecting to have projects considered for funding under the UWIP, must submit all project information within the portal.

Timeline

Although the portal will be open year-round, all current **Utah Project Portal** data will be exported on **December 31, 2025** for incorporation into the **March 1, 2026** UWIP. **Any data entered past this date will be incorporated into next year's agency plans.** A cut-off date will be established annually and, if you have established an account within **Utah Project Portal**, you will receive notification of this date.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

If you previously submitted project information, an account has been established for you and all your project data has been transferred to the new portal. You will receive a notification email from notification@utahprojects.org with your account information. Please login and review **ALL** information within your account to ensure that your entity and project data were transferred correctly.

Please also note that your project title and some limited project information will be publicly available. Therefore, we recommend changing any project names that disclose exact locations or that may contain sensitive information.

How to establish an account in the Utah Project Portal

Did you already submit a project through the UWIP Google form in April or May this year?

- If YES, good news, you already have an account! Please see the important notice above.
- If NO, you will need to create an account for your entity. In order to do so please go to the **Utah Project Portal** and click 'create a new account' and select the entity (city, town, water district, etc.) that you represent. Then enter your details and provide your project data as instructed on the website. Your account will remain pending authorization until it can be verified by the UWIP team. ***If you do not see your entity name on the list, please contact UWIPprojects@utah.gov so we can establish a domain for you. This is to ensure consistency throughout other databases in Utah.

Email notices for creating accounts will be valid for one week. If you have any issues or questions, please reach out us at UWIPprojects@utah.gov.
